What we need

To be considered for a speaker slot at the ASIS Australia Conference 2019, the Conference Organising Committee invites you to submit abstracts for individual presentations by email to events@asisvictoria.org.au providing us with the following information:

1. **Contact information** for you and any joint speaker you require for your presentation. (email, phone, twitter and "preferred name" when referencing you in announcements and schedule.);
2. **The Presentation Title** please name your talk as this will make it easier to reference it;
3. **A short description** (<6 sentences) of **who you are** (bio) that we are permitted to publish in case of your acceptance;
4. **A short description** (<6 sentences) of your **content** that we are permitted to publish in case of your acceptance;
5. **A longer description** of your content for our understanding of your research material and presentation format for our consideration. This could contain any papers, articles or presentation material you have created that will help us understand your content;
6. **References**, if any, to other talks you have given, articles published or videos of previous presentations for our consideration;
7. **The location you would be traveling from**;
8. **Technical requirements** for making your presentation;
9. **The preferred length and possible lengths** of your talk 40 + 5 min Q&A;
10. Has this **presentation been given before** somewhere?
11. Are you willing to have your talk **recorded**?

We are not accepting any vendor pitches or corporate cheerleading talks. You are welcome to talk briefly about what your company does or use corporate slides. However, your talk must focus on sharing your ideas, experience and knowledge with the community, and not selling products and services.

What you receive

As an accepted speaker you will be provided with the following:

- Complimentary access to the ASIS Australia Conference 2019, including catering supplied on the day;
- One (1) complimentary nights' accommodation in Melbourne at the Conference organisers preferred accommodation;

The Schedule

The submission deadlines are:

1. Pre-acceptance round 1: 31 March 2019
2. Pre-acceptance round 2: 30 April 2019
3. Final Submission Deadline: 30 May 2019

To ensure your submission is considered it must be made before 31 March 2019 and to increase your chances of being selected as a speaker it is recommended that your submission is made before 30 April 2019. Acceptance rounds usually takes less than a week to complete.

As a speaker you will be notified that we have received your submission and when we have come to a decision regarding your participation.

Submission Terms and Conditions

1. Presentation must be presented by the named presenter, proxies and replacement speakers are not permitted except for unforeseeable circumstances and illness and must be approved by the conference committee;
2. The Conference Organising Committee reserve the right to allocate presentation time and format;
3. Presentations must be provided in their final format ready for presenting three weeks prior to the Australia Conference, ensuring approval is received from the Conference Organising Committee to proceed;
4. Successful presenters provide consent for photographs to be taken during their presentation at the Conference.
